It is a purely farmer-owned organization, created for the benefit of its member farmers.</p> <p>Operating across 42 villages in the Dindori, Vani, Kalwan, and Surgana circles of Nashik district, SFPCL works with over 35 farmer groups and 1,349 total members. The company aims to expand to 5,000 farmer members as soon as possible.</p> <p>85% of associated farmers are tribal communities. — O P E R A T I O N S

Agri Input Shop & Farmer Facility Center, Khoriphata

During 2015, the company's first Agri-input shop opened in Kasbe Vani. Member farmers received agricultural inputs at reasonable prices. Now relocated to Tomato Market, Khoriphata as a Better Life Farming Center — a comprehensive hub for horticultural crop cultivation guidance on Strawberry, Grapes, Tomato, and more. Strawberry mother plants are also distributed from this center.

Past Operations — Grapes Packing at Farmer Facility Center, Chandikapur

On behalf of the Agricultural Marketing Board, the company set up two pack houses and a farmers' facility centre in Chandikapur (Vani) under the National Horticulture Mission. Grape and tomato sorting and grading are performed here; 20 truckloads of grapes were marketed to Faridabad on a pilot basis.

In 2014–15, SFPCCL farmers collectively marketed 450 tonnes of ripe tomatoes to processing companies including Capricon Food Products India Limited and Varun Agro. This benefitted farmers with an additional Rs. 10–15 per crate over market rate, with savings on middlemen and transportation costs through farm-gate sales.



Tomato Marketing Operations

SFPCCL has supplied onion to WayCool, Spencer, King Burger, Grofers across Chennai, Trichy, Theni, Coimbatore, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Kolkata, Delhi, and Gurgaon. In 2017–18, SFPCCL purchased 800 MT of onion from farmers' fields. In April 2018, SFPCCL obtained export and APEDA licenses. In 2019, 50 MT of onion was sent to a buyer in Italy on an experimental basis.

Present Operations

In the initial stages, the primary crop chosen was grapes. However, significant costs from fungicides and insecticides (40–70% of total farming costs) prompted SFPCL to explore independent agri-input production.

In partnership with the Hydroponic Research Development Center in Hingalwadi, SFPCL now produces its own insecticides and fungicides via hydroponics, directly supplying 3,000+ farmers across Nashik, Nagar, Sangli, Solapur, Satara, and Mahabaleshwar — achieving a 30% reduction in production costs.

In 2017–18, SFPCL purchased 800 MT of onion from farmers' fields. Farmers received an additional Rs. 10–15 per crate over market rates through farm-gate sales, eliminating middlemen costs.

Strawberry Initiative

Introduced in 2021, strawberry cultivation has transformed livelihoods for tribal farmer members. 85% of SFPCL's farmers are tribals. SFPCL established a full supply chain: importing mother plants, conducting expert workshops on fertilizer management, and conducting extensive village visits to promote group farming.

Once the crop is ready for harvest, SFPCL collects the produce directly from farmers' locations, eliminating transport needs and fraudulent trader practices. SFPCL also commenced punnet manufacturing, offering competitive packaging solutions for strawberry farmers.

— FUTURE PLANS

Strawberry Cold Storage & Processing

As strawberries are available in abundant supply but the season is limited, SFPCL is setting up a cold storage facility. Strawberries will be blast-frozen at minus 40°C and stored, ensuring year-round availability for ice cream manufacturers and pharmaceutical companies.

Strawberry Pulping

As strawberries will be available in cold storage throughout the year, SFPCL can extract strawberry pulp, store it aseptically, and supply it to other companies year-round. Strawberry pulp is used for ice cream, wine, jam, chocolates, and more.

Strawberry Wine Industry

With ample raw strawberry supply locally, SFPCL intends to build a strawberry wine industry. During study it has been found that strawberry wine has high medicinal value, and very few companies in India manufacture it — presenting a unique market opportunity.

SFPCL intends to set up a tourist center providing information on how strawberries are farmed, harvested, and made into various products. Tourist involvement will promote strawberries and contribute to the income of local people.

Training & Capacity Building

Extension activities were conducted in Dharashiv, Solapur, Sangli, and Nagar districts covering crop cultivation, fertigation, pest and residue management, sustainable farming practices, and new agricultural technologies.
